This Month in History

New Year's Day. The most celebrated holiday around the world.

January 1, 1863. The Emancipation Proclamation by President Abraham Lincoln freed the slaves in the states rebelling against the Union.



January 2, 1960. In Washington, D.C., Senator John F. Kennedy announced his intention to seek the Democratic presidential nomination.



January 15 Birthday. Martin Luther King (1929-1968) was born in Atlanta, Georgia. As an African American civil rights leader he spoke eloquently and stressed nonviolent methods to achieve equality. He received the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964. He was assassinated in Memphis, Tennessee, on April 4, 1968. In 1983, the third Monday in January was designated a legal holiday in the U.S. to celebrate his birthday.



January 27, 1967. Three American astronauts were killed as a fire erupted inside Apollo 1 during a launch simulation test at Cape Kennedy, Florida.

January 30, 1933. Adolf Hitler was appointed Chancellor of Germany by President Paul von Hindenburg. Hitler went on to become the sole leader of Nazi Germany. He then waged a war of expansion in Europe, precipitating the deaths of an estimated 50 million persons through military conflict and

through the Holocaust in which the Nazis attempted to exterminate the entire Jewish population of Europe.



January 30, 1973. During the Watergate scandal, Gordon Liddy and James McCord were convicted of burglary, wire-tapping and attempted bugging of the Democratic headquarters inside the Watergate building in Washington, D.C.

On January 15, 1929, Martin Luther King, Jr. is born in Atlanta, Georgia, the son of a Baptist minister. King received a doctorate degree in theology and in 1955 helped organize the first

major protest of the African-American civil rights movement: the successful Montgomery Bus Boycott.
